

Disposal Guidelines for ASA Material in the European Union

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Acrylonitrile Styrene Acrylate (ASA) is a thermoplastic polymer known for its weather resistance and mechanical properties, making it suitable for various applications. The proper disposal of ASA materials in the European Union follows specific regulations and guidelines, summarized below.

1. Waste Framework Directive (Directive 2008/98/EC)
